

Domestics Pilot

A pilot program involving Anoka County Justice Partners to expedite “intimate partner” domestic assault cases from incident through disposition.

Pilot Implementation: September 6, 2011

Identifying Cases

Courtroom 1 will be the point of entry for all cases, being in custody domestics or Felony Rule 5 hearings. This only impacts **felony cases** and **non-felony cases occurring in Andover and Oak Grove**. Prosecutors are working with law enforcement to expedite the cases. Prosecutors will identify these cases at initiation; however, some may need to be identified by Court Administration (those appearing in courtroom 1 when the Andover prosecutor isn't present.). The complaint, MNCIS, and court file jacket will all be labeled “Domestic Pilot” to help identify these cases at all court appearances.

Case Flow



- * Both the Pre-Trial date and the Jury Trial date will be given at the 1st appearance.
- * Rasmussen issues will be reserved for the Jury Trial date.
- * The defense will notify the Court and State of any potential Omnibus/Rasmussen issues by identifying the issue(s) on the Pre-Trial order or by written pleadings within 14 days of the Pre-Trial.



- * Both the Pre-Trial date and the Jury Trial date will be given at the 1st appearance.
- * Contested Omnibus/Rasmussen issues will be reserved for the Jury Trial date.
- * The defense will notify the Court and State of any potential Omnibus/Rasmussen issues by identifying the issue(s) on the Pre-Trial order or by written pleadings within 30 days of the Pre-Trial.



- * Contested Omnibus/Rasmussen issues will be reserved for the Jury Trial date, or COH date, if available.
- * The defense will notify the Court and State of any potential Omnibus/Rasmussen issues by identifying the issue(s) on the scheduling order or by written pleadings within 30 days of the Rule 8.
