2010 Accomplishments:

- Sanford and Walker Cottages closed January 31st, 2010. The transition to the “new” facility, Anoka County Secure (ACS), (formerly Adult Medium Security facility which closed in September 2009) although posed challenges, was a success.
- Staff duties/training, programming models, and operational standards were created and implemented to fit the new facility.
- Short-term (STT) programming was very difficult in the initial transition period. Sanford and Walker Cottages each had a STT group. When ACS opened, the two STT groups were combined into one creating a larger than expected group due to increased referrals.
- Evaluated both Long-term treatment programs and identified areas of change regarding treatment plans and objectives of the program. Implementation to occur in 2011.
- Although the facility move posed a variety of changes, this cost center achieved revenue projections for 2010.
- Provided a variety of summer school activities and community speakers including: Alexandra House, Birds and Bees, MADD Panel, Andre Koen – Culture, Canoe building – Urban Explorers, Dog Therapy, Anoka County Parks – community work service, internet safety class.

2010 Outcomes:

- At the suggestion of the Department of Corrections license inspection, successfully addressed and lowered the use of disciplinary room time throughout the year. The 2010 Department of Corrections licensing inspection report required ACS to complete a more detailed quarterly review of Restrictive Procedures. An analysis of restrictive procedures was developed and implemented.
- Completed Sex Specific Program (SSP) Recidivism Study in 2010 with the following results: From 1992-2009, 3.92% of youth (153 youth) graduating from the SSP program was sentenced with a felony within one year of release (non CSC related) and 2.61% of youth was sentenced with a new sex offense.

From 1992-2009, 28.76% of youth (153 youth) graduating from the SSP program was sentenced with felony within five years of release (non CSC related) and 11.11% of youth was sentenced with a new sex offense.

- Only 10 youth, parent, and agent surveys received in 2010. Continue to address and work to increase responses to surveys. These surveys are an important component to evaluate the entire program.

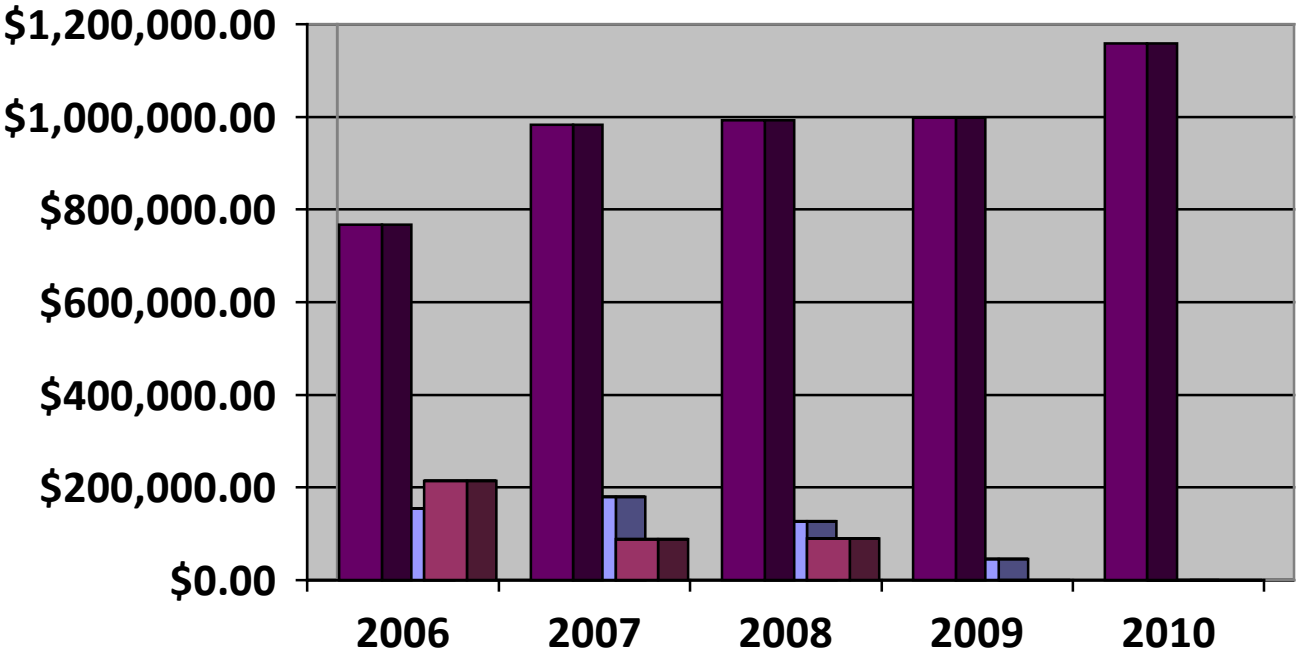

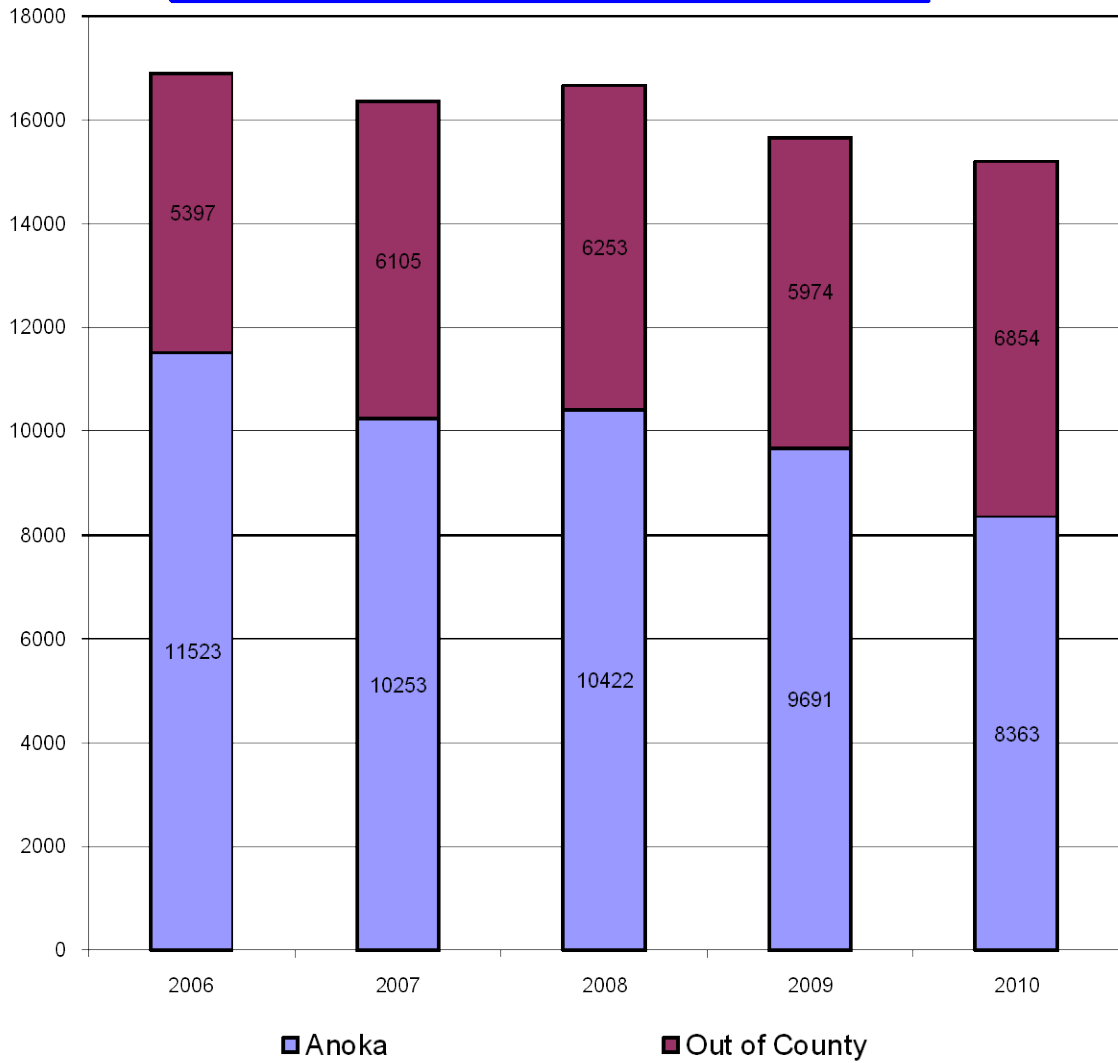

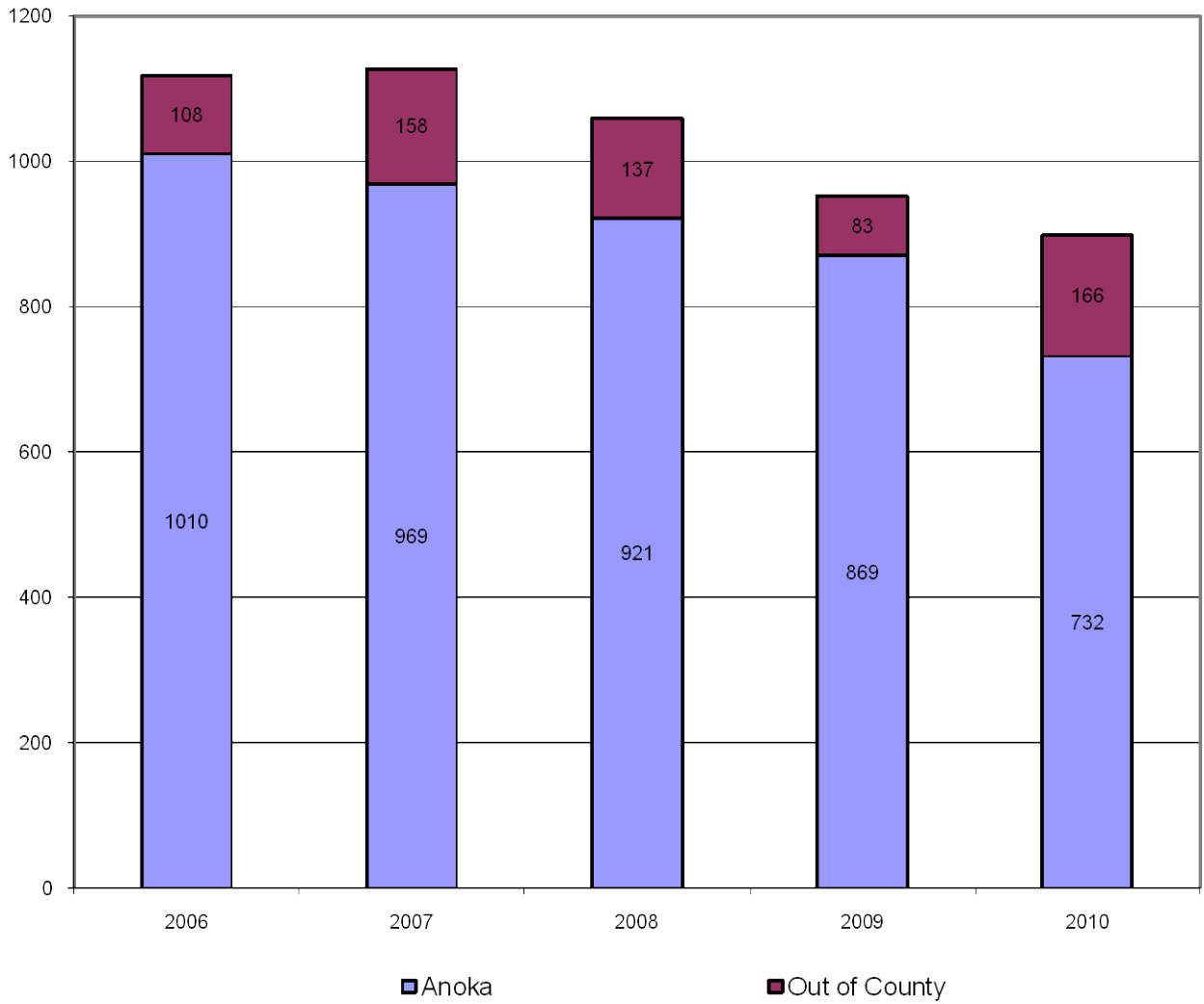
Revenue from Correctional Beds Sold

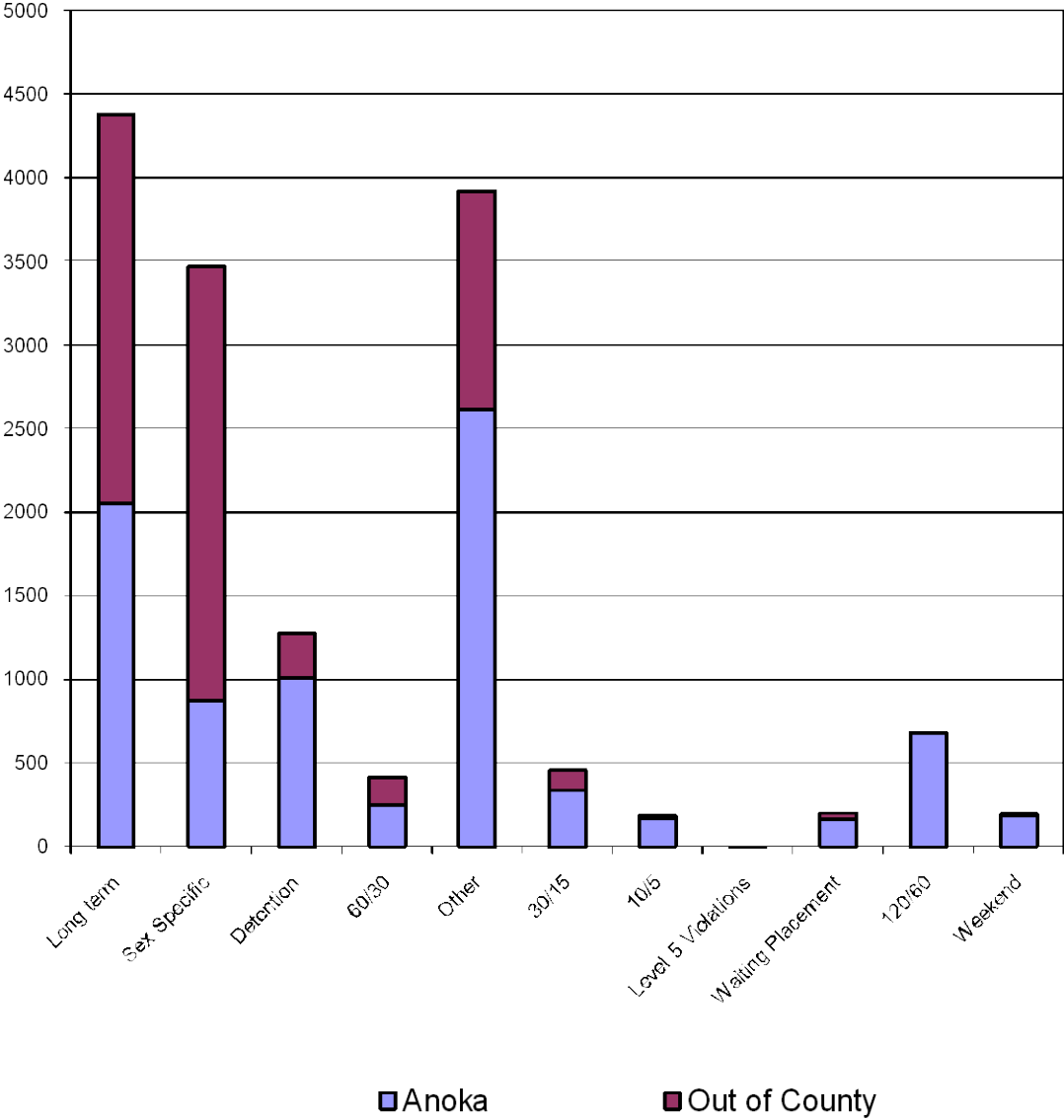

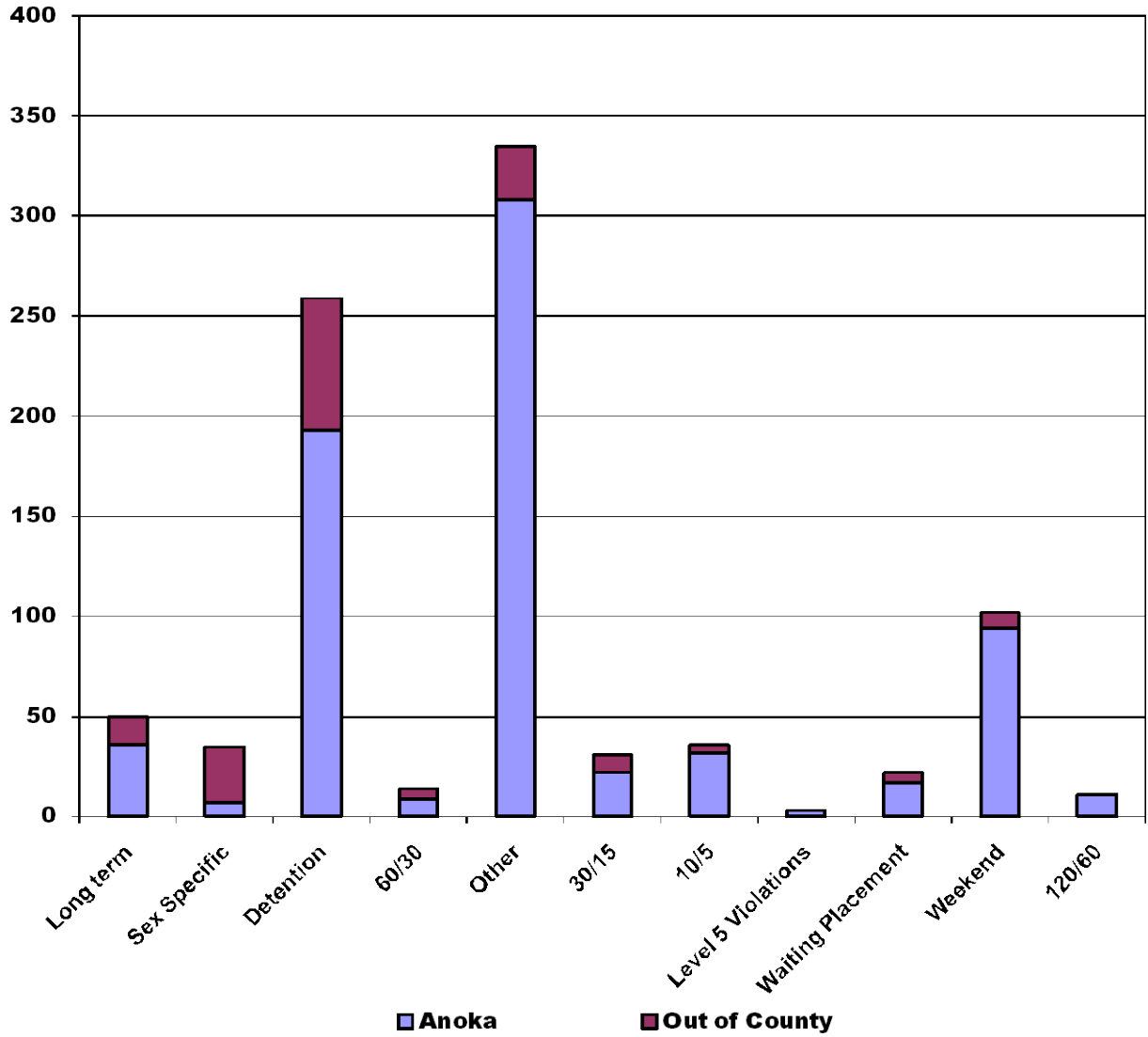

Outcomes 2009 Sex Specific Program Recidivism Rate

153 youth have successfully completed the Sex Specific Program since it began in 1992 through 2009. Of those:

- ❖ 96% had no new felony offenses within one year of discharge
- ❖ 97% had no new sex offenses within one year of discharge
- ❖ 71% had no new felony offenses within 5 years of discharge
- ❖ 89% had no new felony sex offenses within 5 years of discharge

2010 Accomplishments :

- The Anoka County after hours emergency social services (ESS), formerly delivered by contract provider Red Cross, completed its first full year being managed by Non-Secure Program (NSP) staff. This service brings additional annual revenue of \$53,000 via Social Service contract into the Non-Secure Program (NSP) cost center.
 - Comparisons from 2009 to 2010:
 - Total number of calls increased from 492 in 2009 to 517 in 2010
 - Total number of child placements made decreased from 99 in 2009 to 60 in 2010
 - A new electronic form developed by a team from the Information Services Dept improved the effectiveness of the overall program, from Corrections staff completing the front end information-gathering, to the final data collection needed for reporting and program planning by the Social Services Dept.
- The use of technology was increased by eliminating the stand-up population flow board (as a result of a data privacy recommendation from Risk Management) and relying more on the scheduling component of the JAIMS intake system. The medication flow board was also removed from public viewing area.
- Provided a variety of summer school activities and community speakers including: Alexandra House, Birds and Bees, Genesis II – Life Skills, Dog Therapy, National Youth Program using Mini Bikes; Yoga Class, Anoka County Parks community work service, etc.

2010 Outcomes:

Internal outcomes on number of runs from the program and number of critical incidents/restraints:

- Internal outcomes remain to be positive. In 2010 there were a total of three walk offs (runs) and nine (9) restraints. Of the nine restraints, eight resulted from the same two youth.
- Disciplinary Room Time (DRT) was utilized for consequence purposes in 56 incidents, involving 93 individual youth. Data was not compiled in 2009 for incidents of DRT.
- Positive survey responses were collected from 13 referral agents, 28 residents, and 21 parents.

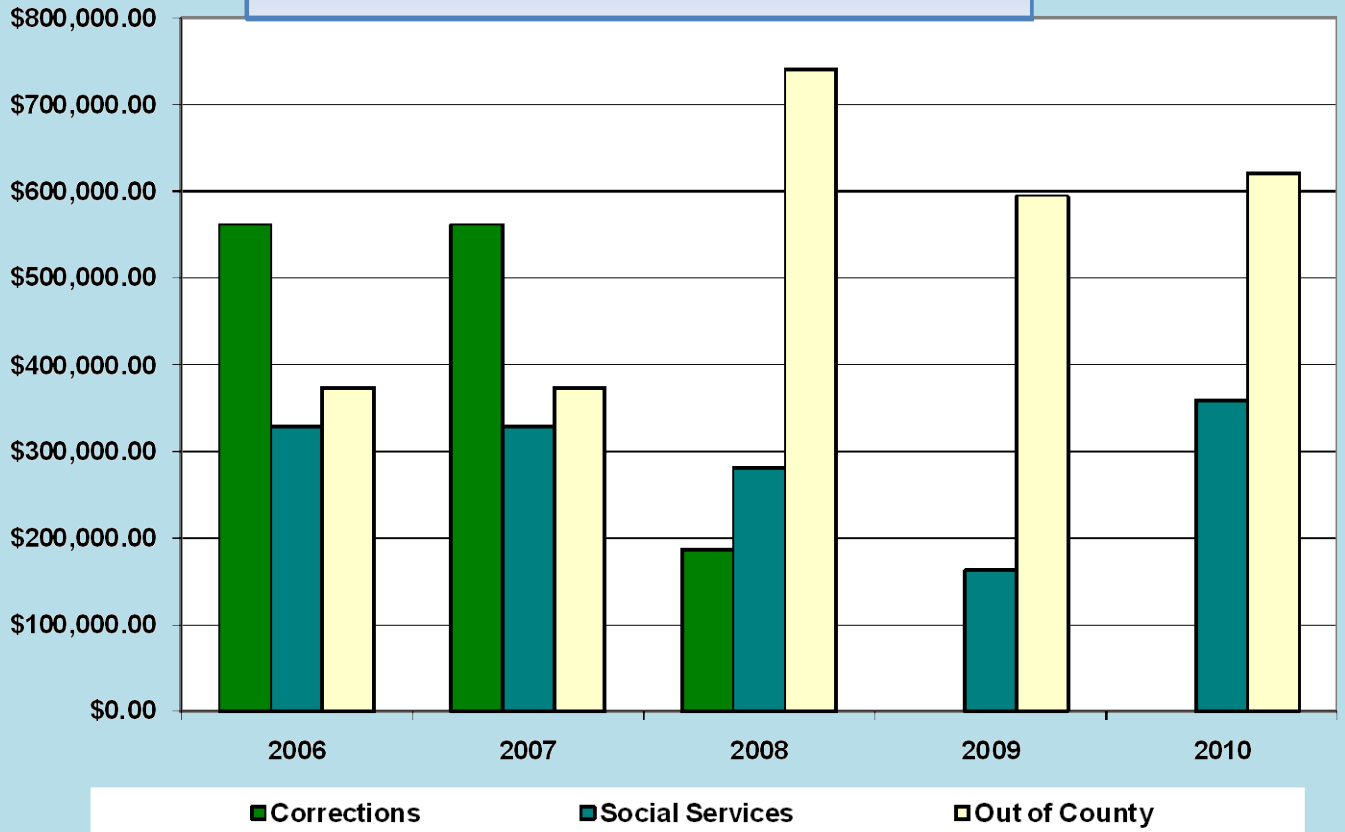

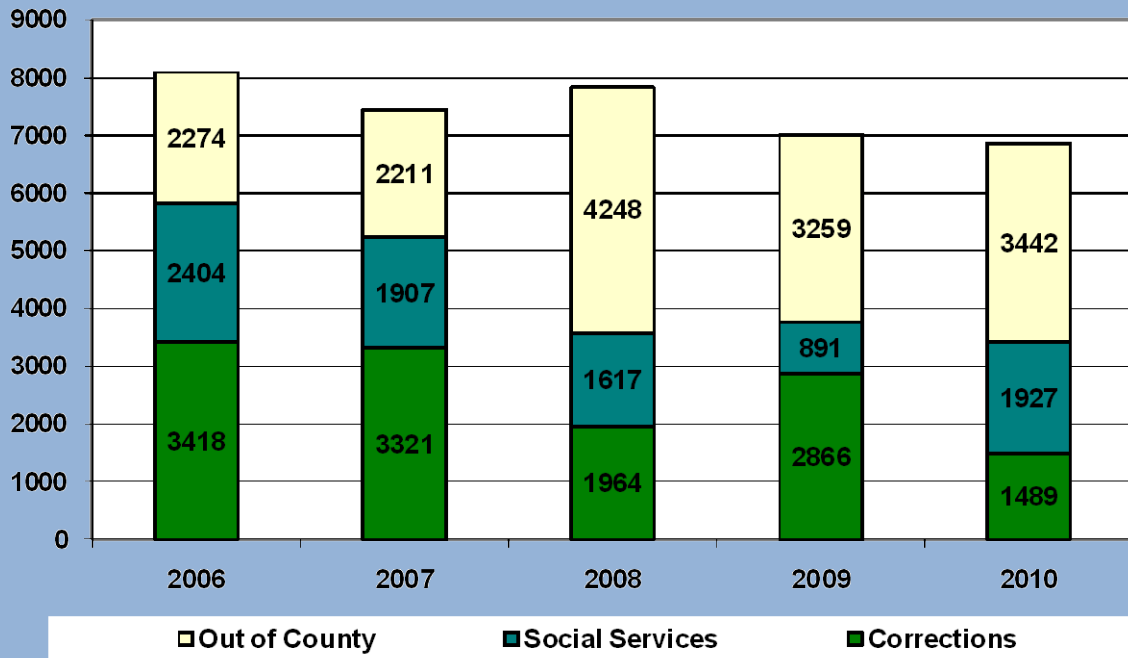

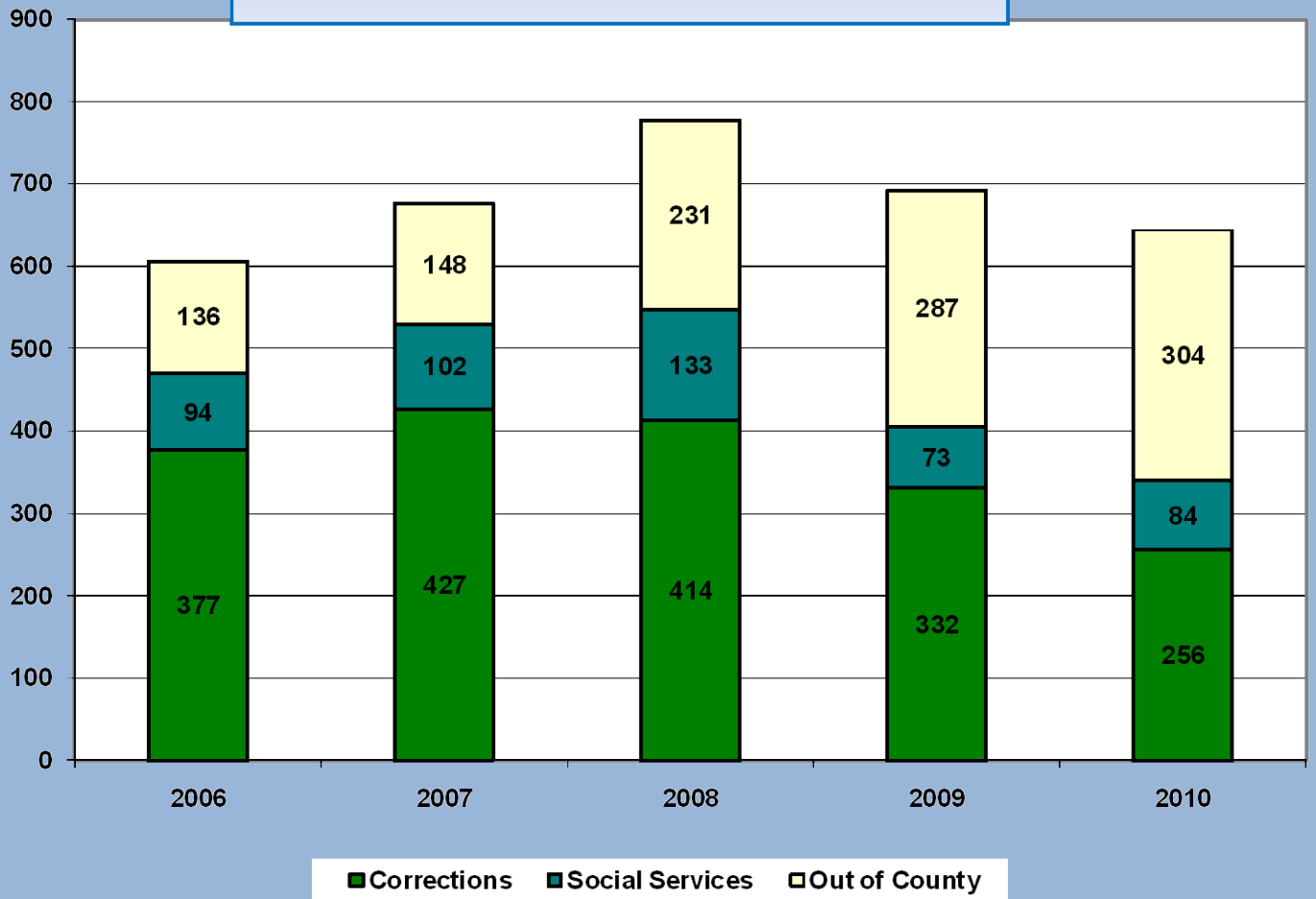
Revenue from Non-Secure Beds Sold

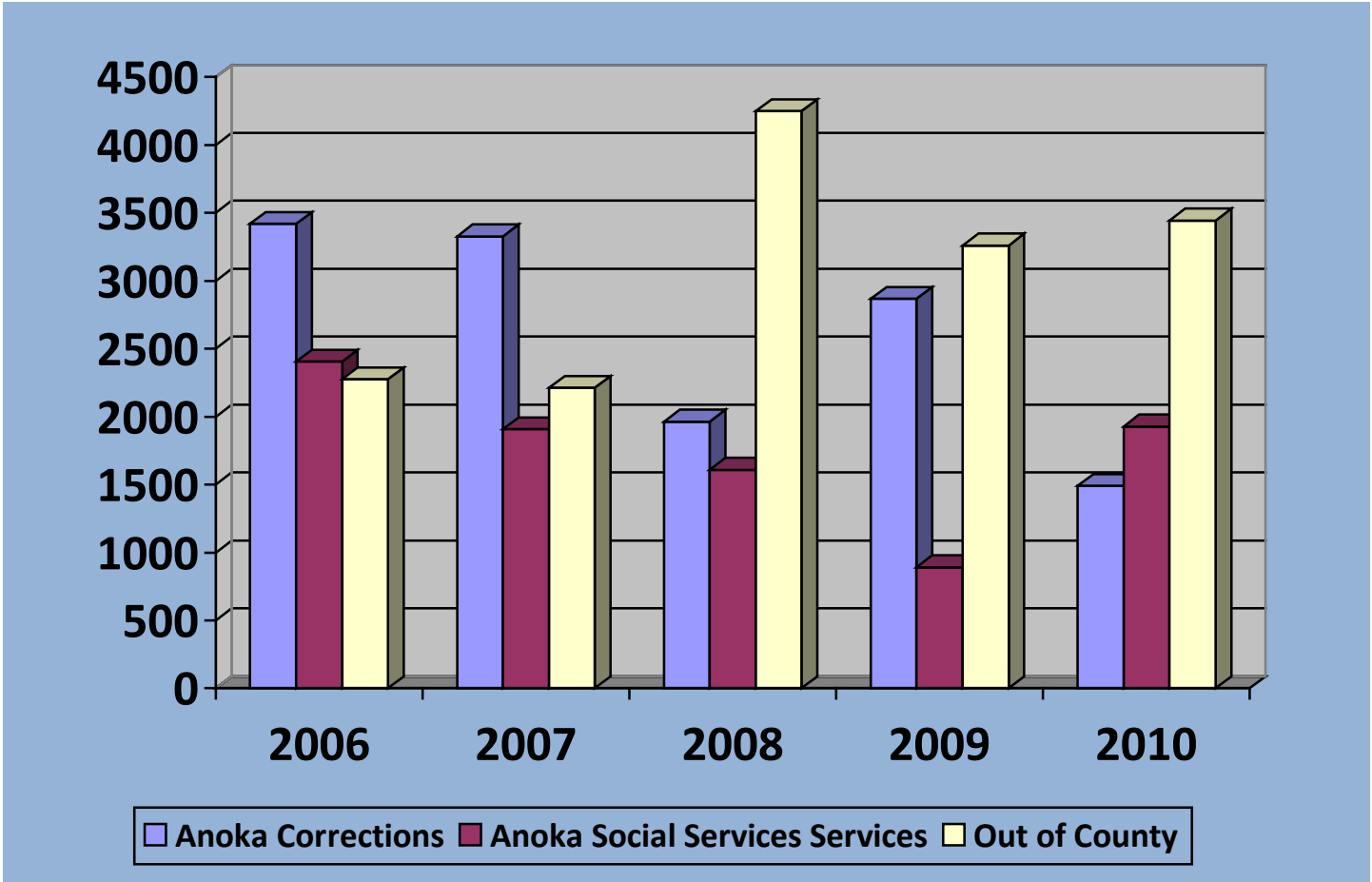

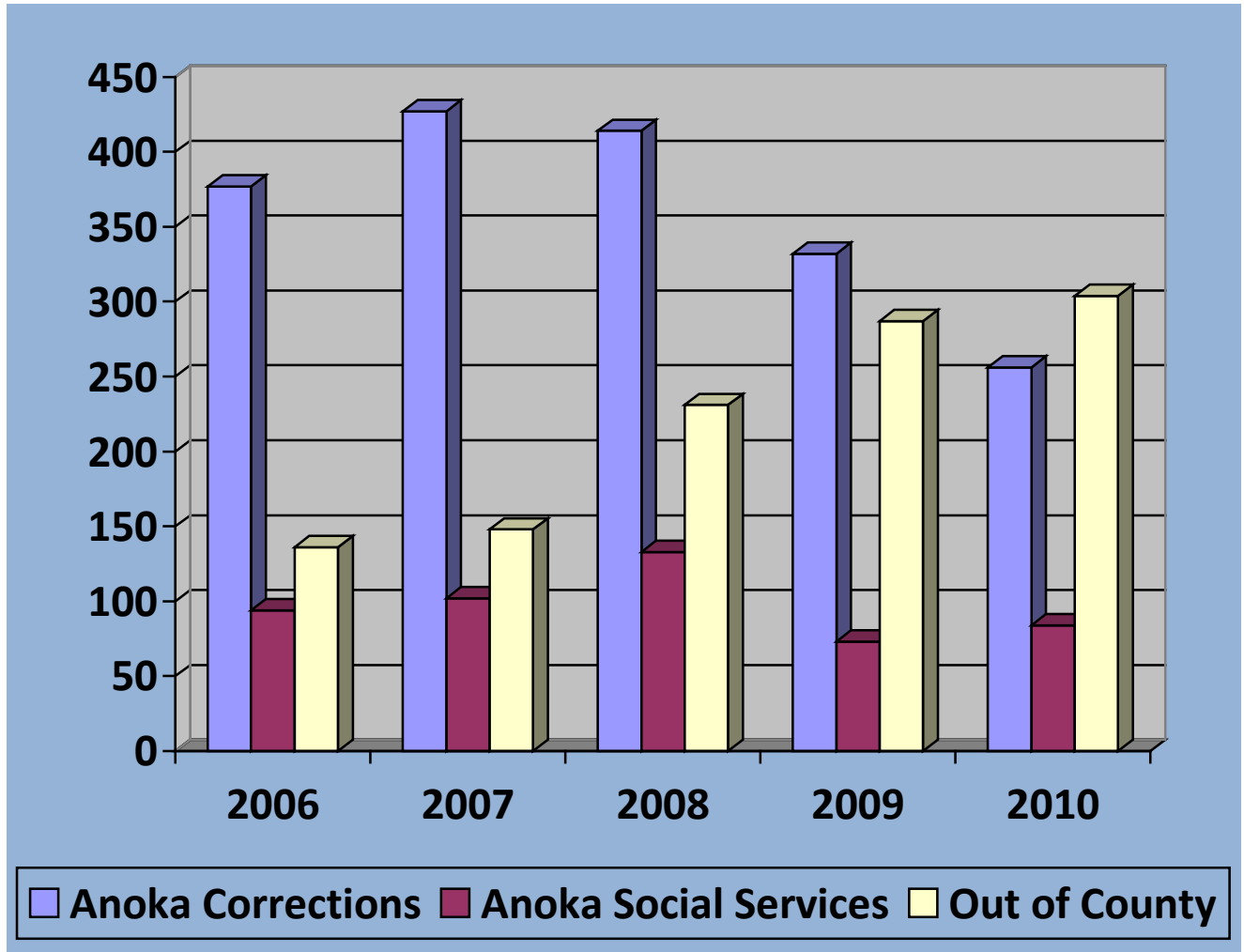

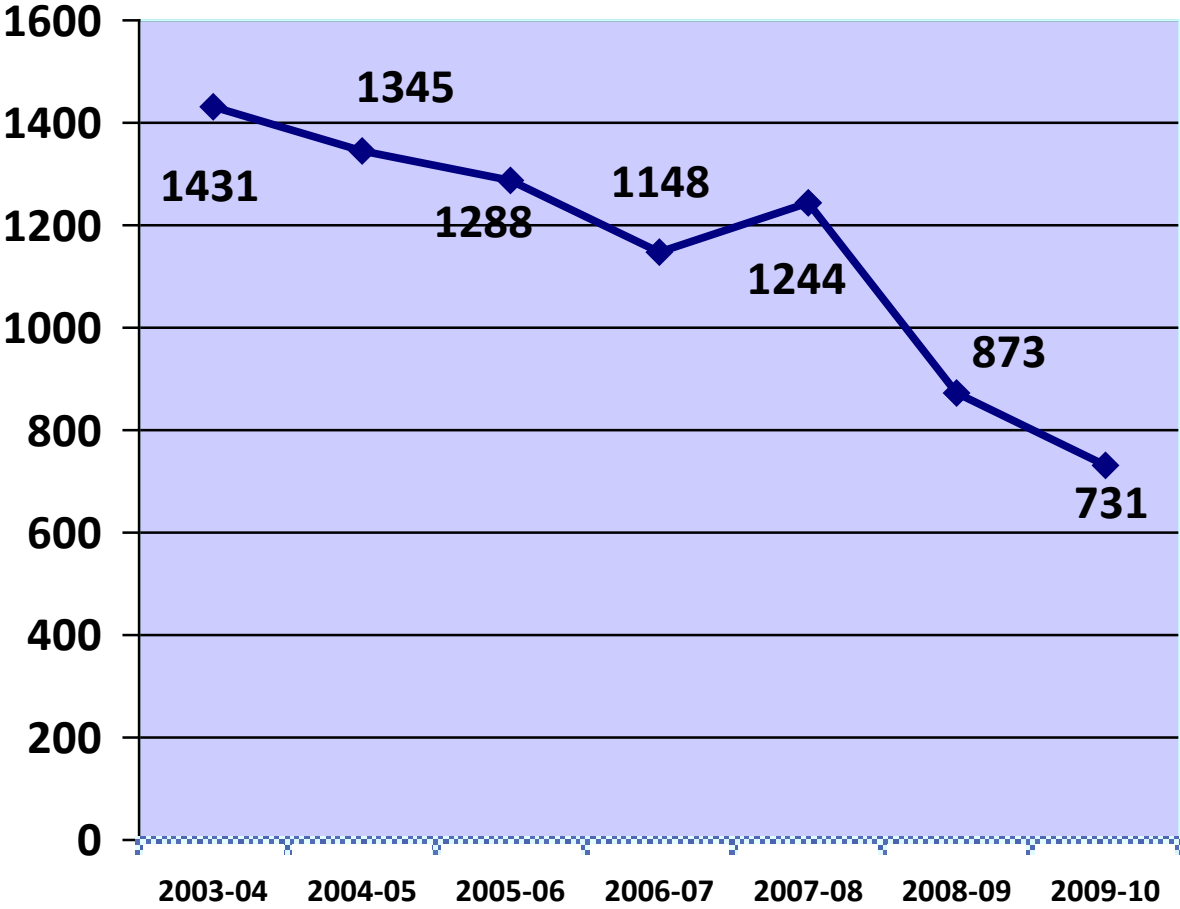

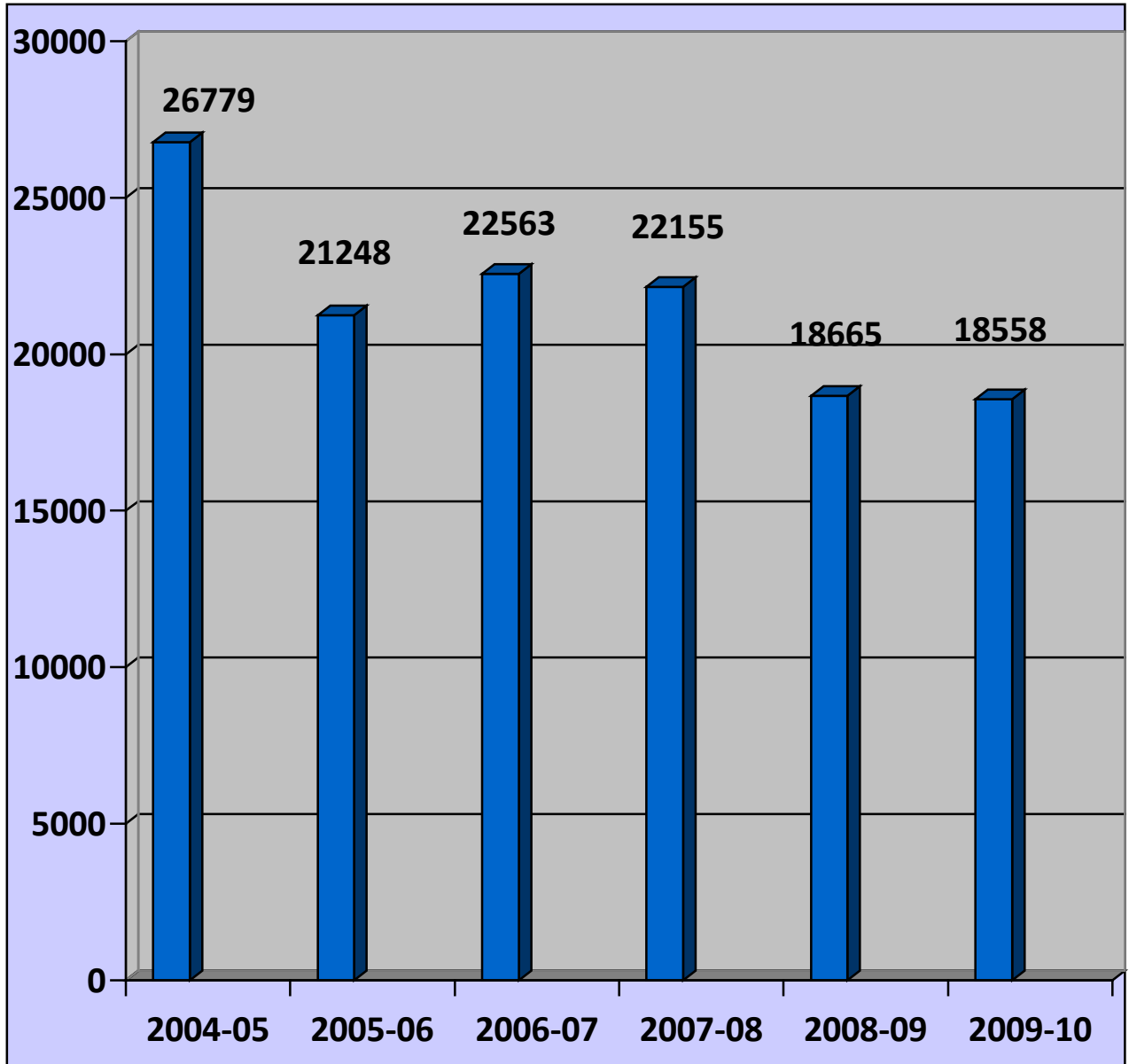

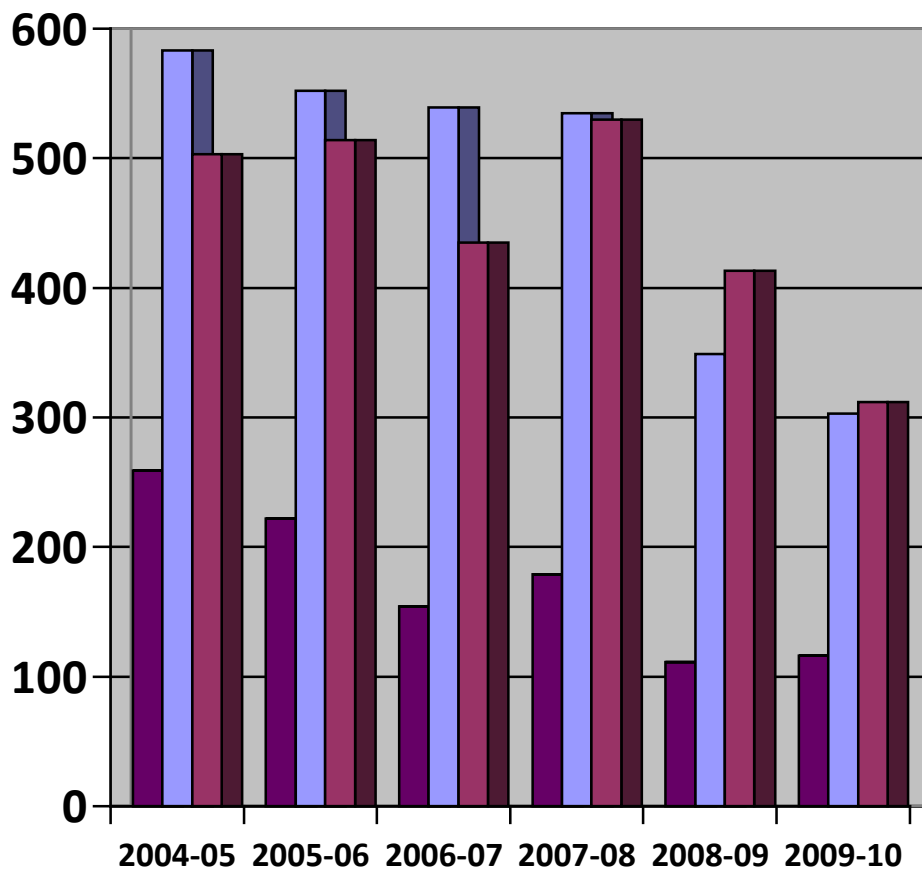
Enrollment Trend
