Fahr Building - Rum River Human Service Center

- Focus on drug and alcohol related programs.
- The unit facilitates the DWI Education program for first- or second-time DWI offenders.
- The unit coordinates urinalysis services for Corrections and collection for Social Services.
- The unit operates the Repeat Offender Program (ROP). This is a program that enhances supervision by providing additional contacts and surveillance to ensure that repeat DWI offenders maintain sobriety.
- The unit facilitates hook-ups and ensures compliance for those offenders who are sentenced to home electronic monitoring.
- The unit provides specialized supervision for DWI and criminal vehicular operation offenders. Agents utilize traditional services such as monitoring conditions, conducting case planning, collaboration with treatment providers, and facilitation of support services for those offenders with severe alcohol dependency.
- Project SAVE (Specialized Alcohol Violation Enforcement) is a program that applies random electronic alcohol testing aimed at the repeat DWI offender. The program is designed to take a comprehensive view of offender sobriety on an annual basis throughout supervision.
- The unit facilitates cognitive programming for all adult offenders.
- The unit runs the ISAP pre-trial program for repeat DWI offenders.

Anoka County Courthouse - First Floor

- The unit completes all felony pre-sentence investigations with the exception of sex offenders.
- Provides pre-trial bail evaluations to assist the court in determining whether bail should be applied prior to release.
- Conducts Rule 25 assessments for both Social Services and Corrections clients.
- Completes misdemeanor and gross misdemeanor pre-sentence investigations.
- Attends revocation hearings for a significant number of the department's violations.

- Sex offender supervision starts with the pre-sentence investigation completed by this unit and continues through years of supervision.
- The domestic abuse caseloads include misdemeanor, gross misdemeanor, and felony level offenders that are assessed at higher risk to reoffend.
- Both the sex offender agents and the domestic abuse agents are specialists in their respective areas. They monitor conditions, conduct case planning, collaborate with treatment providers, utilize polygraph and other cutting edge methodologies in the supervision of these offenders.

- The unit supervises felony offenders assessed at higher risk for re-offense. The felons range from property / drug offenders to serious assault offenders.
- The unit also consists of a team of staff who supervise intensive supervised releasees through the Department of Corrections (ISR). These offenders are the highest risk releasees including Level 3 sex offenders.
- The unit also processes all transfer-in cases and facilitates the transfer-out of approximately half the out-of-county offenders sentenced in Anoka County.
- Staff monitor conditions, conduct case planning, collaborate with treatment providers, and maintain a community presence.

- The unit supervises approximately 3,800 low-risk misdemeanor, gross misdemeanor and felony level offenders.
- Staff monitor conditions with limited client contact.
- The unit facilitates the transfer of approximately half the cases transferred by Anoka County out to other counties.
- The unit is assisted through elaborate computer systems to help ensure compliance.
