The attention of the bidders is directed to know that the 2005 Minnesota Department of Transportation Standard Specifications for Highway Construction shall govern this project except as stated in the proposal. The attention of bidders is directed to Specification No. 1801 covering sub-letting or assigning portions of the contract. The wage rates for the project have been predetermined and are available in the Office of the County Engineer.
